Dear Parents,

Health week:

The children have had a very busy health week this week. Each class were able to bring in their bicycles or scooters for a day. Y4 and Y5 started their health and well-being programme which will finish next week (please remember Y4 and Y5 parents, as per the text sent out on Tuesday, that there will be a parent meeting about the programme next Thursday 17th from 9-10am). Every class had a food nutrition session with Chartwells and a hygiene and healthy teeth session with the school nurse. Most children from Y2 – Y6 took part in age appropriate sex and relationship lessons. Finally sports day was a lovely inclusive affair that saw all children enjoying physical activity and competing against each other. Today the children have completed a questionnaire to gain their views on PE, sport and being healthy at Friars.

Netball news:

Throughout the summer term 2014, we have been training for and competing in the London PE and School Sports Network Primary High 5 netball league. A total of 22 teams participated from 17 different schools. We had two teams (A and B). The B team came 4th in their group and did not proceed to the knock out stages. The A team however won their group and did make it to the knock outs.

On Wednesday of this week, we faced the Surrey Square School A team in the quarter final and beat them 4-1. We then went on to beat Bellenden School in the semi-final, 1-0. The final was a tense standoff against the St Joseph's Borough team. We are delighted to report that we won 2-1 and so became the overall champions of the league! We must thank the three parents, Lyn Meade, Kristine Allen and Vicky Sabarias who have been coaching the teams and escorting them to all the matches. They have done a fantastic job! Also we are very proud not only of all the members of the A team but the B team too who were gracious in defeat and who supported the winners so positively.

Gardening club news:

Friars Gardening Club made it to the finals of a Southwark-wide school gardening competition. 16 schools entered the competition and we got to the final 4. The competition, based on the theme 'How Children Grow', aims to encourage children to grow fruit and vegetables and eat more healthily. Judges visited our school garden on Tuesday 1st July to help make their final decision. Although we did not win the competition we are proud to announce that we came 3rd overall. Well done to Miss Coate and her green fingered crew of gardeners!
