Potential closure:

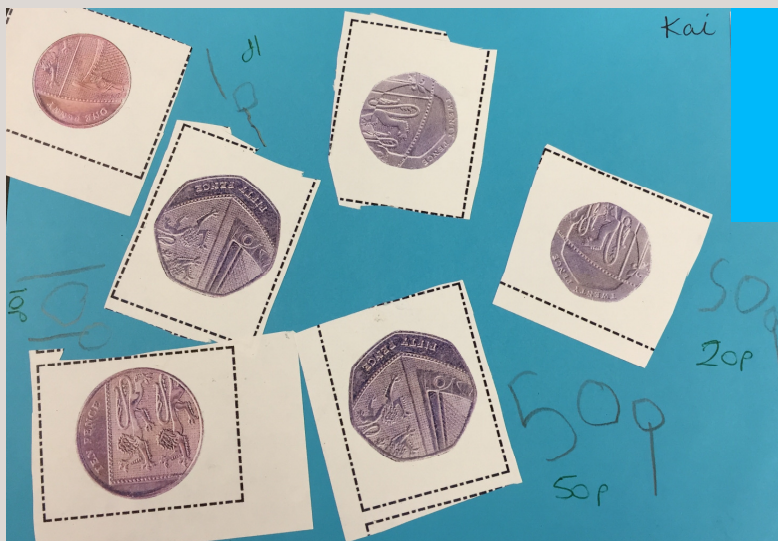
