Parent Questionnaire:

Sport and dance at Friars:

On Tuesday of this week, our Year 5 children, alongside 10 other primary and secondary schools, performed a dance in the Clore Ballroom at the Royal Festival Hall. It was the culmination of several workshops with an animateur from Ballet Rambert. Our dance was inspired by Ballet Rambert's dance piece, "The Charm of Mother Nature" by the choreographer Mark Baldwin. The name of our dance was "Fidgeting Atoms" and in it the children explored atoms and the particles they are made up of. They discovered how they move and join together to create bigger objects. Despite a few pre performance nerves they did fantastically well. They were incredibly focussed and performed excellently as a group! On Wednesday it was Year 4's turn to represent the school at a benchball tournament at Globe Academy. They had been training hard in PE lessons recently so were well prepared. They competed against five other schools and we are pleased to let you know that they came 2nd overall!

Solar Eclipse:

You will all know that there was a solar eclipse today. Unfortunately because of an overcast sky we could not see anything but it did feel colder and darker on the playground this morning. In assembly we also showed the children a BBC explanation so that they could understand more. We also reminded the children that they should never look directly at the sun. An eclipse of the sun happens whenever the moon gets between the Earth and the Sun so that the moon blocks your view of the sun. The moon passes between the Earth and the sun once every month, at the new moon, but most of the time the moon is either too high up or too low to block our view of the sun. About twice a year, the moon does get in the way of the sun, causing an eclipse. But even then, you can only see the eclipse from some places on Earth. Birds roost in the trees, thinking it is bedtime. A total solar eclipse only lasts about four minutes; then the moon moves slowly out of the way of the sun. It gets light again, and the birds wake up.
