Basic Skills Primary Quality Mark:

The basic skills Quality Mark is an award that celebrates and supports continuous improvement in literacy and numeracy. It is awarded to schools to recognise their provision, practice and performance in literacy and numeracy, and is valid for three years. We attained this award for the first time in 2009 and we successfully renewed it in 2012. We are proud to announce that we had our 2015 renewal assessment this week and have been given the award for the third time in a row. We had to demonstrate a whole school approach to improving standards in literacy and numeracy, with evidence of the impact of our approaches. The award also gives us a framework to help continually improve the basic skills of all pupils at Friars, including those who underachieve and those who under attain. This is an important achievement for the school and I must congratulate all the staff and of course our fantastic children who are so hard working and keen to do well!
