Dear Parents.

Welcome back to a brand new school year! We hope you all had a restful summer. It was lovely to see all the children back and to hear about their holidays. As always, though, this will be an action packed term with lots to look forward to.

Staffing news:

This week we welcome our two new teachers, Ms. Allen in Year 3 and Ms. McKenzie in Y4. In addition Roxanne Knight and Talisa O'Connor have joined us through an agency as teaching assistants. Mrs. Bolton, our Nursery teacher was due to go on maternity leave later in September but has now been advised to take it earlier which means she will not be returning to Friars before her baby is born. Building works:
