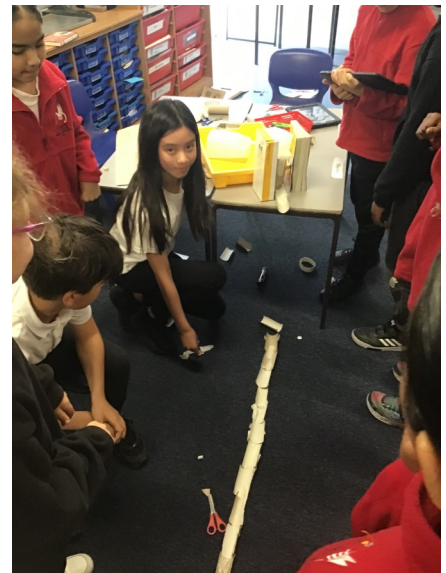
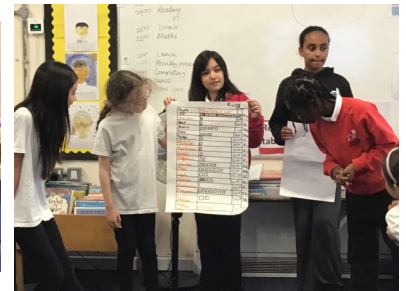
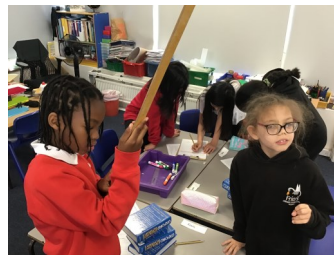

On Day 1, they built the tallest freestanding paper towers, carefully considering shape, structure and design. On Day 2, they created mystery patterns for other teams to solve, earning points for difficulty, creativity and presentation. On Day 3, teams took on a marble run challenge, designing ramps and improving them through testing.
